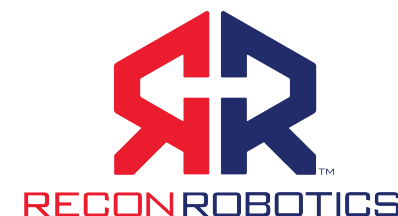

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CONFERENCE PRESENTERS

TRAVIS R. BERG

Owner, FinancialCop

Travis R. Berg is a Network Intrusion Forensic Analyst with the United States Secret Service's National Computer Forensics Institute. He began his law enforcement career in 2001 with the Tulsa County Sheriff's Office before joining the Tulsa Police Department in 2005, where he served as a patrol officer, detective, field training officer, traffic investigator, and member of the Cyber Crimes Unit. As an Advanced Traffic Investigator, Berg served as the primary investigator on 27 fatality collisions and assisted with numerous additional fatality investigations. His experience also includes incident management, digital evidence investigations, and specialized law enforcement assignments.

Berg joined the U.S. Secret Service in 2023 after previously supporting the agency's National Computer Forensics Institute while with the Tulsa Police Department. He has extensive training and experience in digital and mobile-device forensics, cybercrime investigations, network intrusion, ransomware investigations, social media, and digital evidence recovery. He has served as a guest instructor for cybersecurity courses at the University of Tulsa and has taught numerous courses through the NCFI. Berg holds bachelor's degrees in Criminal Justice and Computer Science from Northeastern State University and is a Certified Forensic Computer Examiner through IACIS.

DR. RYAN BROWN

Clinical Professor, OU College of Medicine

Dr. Ryan D. Brown, MD, is a Clinical Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and serves as the Director of Child Abuse Pediatrics within the Section of Pediatric Emergency Medicine. Board-certified in both Pediatrics and Child Abuse Pediatrics, Dr. Brown has dedicated his career to emergency pediatric care, child maltreatment prevention, and advocacy for vulnerable pediatric populations. In addition to his academic and clinical roles at Oklahoma Children's Hospital, he serves as the Chair of the Department of Pediatrics Child Protection Team and Assistant Chief Child Abuse Examiner for the State of Oklahoma.

A nationally recognized expert on child abuse and neglect, Dr. Brown has authored numerous peer-reviewed publications, textbook chapters, and educational materials addressing physical abuse, failure to thrive, pediatric emergency care, and Native American child health. He has served on the Board of Directors for the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children (APSAC) and the Child Abuse Medical Advisory Council for the Midwest Regional Children's Advocacy Center. His clinical and research contributions extend to major multi-center studies, including landmark trials on youth-onset Type 2 diabetes and pediatric emergency protocols.

Dr. Brown is also an accomplished educator and advocate, frequently delivering national lectures, grand rounds, and media commentaries on pediatric safety, injury prevention, and child protection. Throughout his distinguished career, he has been honored with numerous institutional and state awards, including the District Attorneys' Appreciation Award from the Oklahoma District Attorney Association, the Physician of the Year Award from the Oklahoma Academy of Physician Assistants, and multiple medical school teaching and mentorship honors.



JOHN CLEVELAND

Assistant District Attorney, Oklahoma County District Attorney's Office

John Cleveland currently serves as the Team Leader of the Special Victims Unit (SVU) at the Oklahoma County District Attorney's Office. In that role, he works closely with law enforcement investigators across the county to ensure cases are thoroughly investigated and ready to move forward for prosecution. During his career as a prosecutor he has handled cases ranging from misdemeanor DUIs to Murder in the First Degree. For the past five years, his practice has focused primarily on crimes against children.

Before becoming a prosecutor, Cleveland worked for the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services. He left the agency 10 years ago to pursue his goal of becoming an SVU prosecutor, a role he considers one of the great honors of his life.

NICK DAUGHERTY

Owner, FinancialCop

Nick Daugherty served with the Grand Prairie Police Department for two decades in roles ranging from patrol officer and school resource officer to criminal intelligence unit sergeant before retiring in 2023. Early in his career, Nick personally overcame more than \$80,000 in consumer debt by committing to disciplined financial strategies and working over a thousand hours of overtime. Recognizing a widespread need for financial literacy among his peers, he developed a progressive wellness curriculum in 2011 for police recruits that soon expanded into mandatory training across numerous agencies.

Today, Nick is the owner of FinancialCop, a leading national financial wellness group and fiduciary financial planning firm dedicated to first responders. Having completed advanced coursework through Ken Zahn's Certified Financial Planner program, his "Building Financial Strength in First Responder Families" training has reached personnel from over 4,000 agencies nationwide. His mission is to empower first responders and their families to achieve true financial independence and retire on their own terms.

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MARK DRUMMOND

Special Agent, Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation

Mark O. Drummond is a Special Agent with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI), bringing more than 27 years of law enforcement experience to the Special Investigations Unit. He specializes in oilfield theft, auto theft, and public corruption investigations. A Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE), licensed polygraph examiner, and law enforcement instructor, he holds a B.S. in Criminal Justice Management and Ethics along with an Advanced CLEET certification. In 2022, he received the OSBI Legion of Merit Award for his lead role in a complex embezzlement and money laundering investigation.

Agent Drummond regularly serves as an instructor for basic police and OSBI agent academies, teaching courses on financial crimes, auto theft, and oilfield theft investigations. He serves on the Board of Directors for the Oklahoma City Chapter of the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners and is a member of the FBI Safe Trails Task Force.

JERRY FLOWERS

Oilfield Security Consultant

Colonel Jerry Flowers (Ret.) spans a 50-year law enforcement career in Oklahoma, including 34 years with the Oklahoma City Police Department and 11 years as Chief Special Agent for the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry Investigative Services Unit. During his tenure with OCPD, he served as a senior gang detective, hostage negotiator, and FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force member. Recognized for his heroics during the 1995 Oklahoma City Bombing rescue efforts, he was awarded the OCPD Medal of Valor. A pioneer in gang intelligence, he established OCPD's Street Gang Unit and founded the Oklahoma Gang Investigators Association.

Currently, Colonel Flowers co-owns Flowers Law Enforcement Training & Security Consulting, LLC and serves as an oil and gas criminal investigator for Flywheel Energy. He is the founder of the Metal Investigators Sharing Team (M.I.S.T.), which brings together law enforcement and industry investigators across Oklahoma and Texas to combat energy-sector crime. An accomplished CLEET-certified instructor, he has trained state, federal, and international law enforcement personnel throughout his career.

CHIEF JAMES FRY (RET.)

Moscow Police Department

James Fry Jr. is a native of Idaho who earned both his Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice and Master's in Curriculum and Instruction from the University of Idaho. He began his law enforcement career with the Moscow Police Department as a Reserve Officer in 1993, advancing through every rank in the department over a 29-year tenure. Appointed Chief of Police in 2016, Fry served in that leadership role until his retirement in April 2024, during which he oversaw the high-profile Idaho 4 homicide investigation that gained national and international attention.

Throughout his career, Chief Fry has been deeply involved in state-level leadership, education, and board service. He served as Vice Chairman of the Idaho Police Officers Standards and Training (POST) Council, sat on both the Idaho School Safety and Security Board and Governor's Opioid Advisory Board, and taught Leadership in Policing at the University of Idaho. A graduate of the 275th session of the FBI National Academy, Fry returned to executive leadership in June 2025 as the Chief of Police for the West Richland Police Department.

BETH GREEN

Major Case Specialist, Behavioral Analysis Unit, Federal Bureau of Investigation

Since 2024, Beth Green has been a Major Case Specialist (MCS) profiler at the Behavioral Analysis Unit 4 (Crimes Against Adults) of the FBI in Quantico, VA. Green began her policing career in 2000 as a patrol officer with the Warr Acres Police Department (OK). In 2005, she promoted to detective. In 2007, Green was hired as an agent with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. In 2013, Green promoted to lieutenant over the Crime Scene Investigation Unit-West, supervising agents and crime scene investigations in the western two-thirds of Oklahoma. In 2019, she transferred to the South Central Region as a lieutenant, supervising agents and major crimes investigations. In 2020, Green promoted to captain.

As the commander of the South Central Region, Green supervised lieutenants and their teams, managed all regional investigations, collaborated with law enforcement and prosecuting agencies, contributed to strategic planning and special projects, and oversaw the day-to-day operations of the region. Beyond her operational roles, Green has been deeply committed to education and training. Throughout her career, she has provided training to local, state, federal, and international law enforcement partners. From 2016 to 2024, Green served as the chair of the Criminal Justice Department and director of the Master of Science/Art in Criminology Program at Oklahoma City University. Green has a PhD in sociology from the University of Oklahoma.



MERYDITH HARMON

First Assistant, District 21 District Attorney's Office

Merydith Harmon is the First Assistant District Attorney for District 21 – serving Cleveland, McClain, and Garvin Counties. Harmon has Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and English from the University of Central Oklahoma. She graduated from the University of Oklahoma School of Law in December of 2010. Prior to working in District 21, Harmon worked as an Assistant District Attorney in the Oklahoma County DA's Office for 12 years. In 2022, she supervised the felony Domestic Violence Team in Oklahoma County. Harmon's career has focused primarily on the prosecution of cases involving the physical and sexual abuse of children, adult sex crimes, and capital murder. Harmon enjoys prosecuting crimes captured on video and traveling.

JARROD LEAMAN

Senior Litigation Specialist, U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Oklahoma

Jarrold Leaman is a Senior Litigation Counsel with the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Oklahoma, where he has served since 2018. His work has focused primarily on violent crime in Indian Country, civil rights prosecutions, and law enforcement education and training. He currently serves in the office's appellate divisions, where he drafts complex legal filings and regularly appears before the United States Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit. He also serves as the office's Giglio Requesting and Review Official, Anti-Terrorism Advisory Council Coordinator, Border Security Coordinator, Victim's Rights Attorney Coordinator, Professional Responsibility Officer, and Public Affairs Officer.

Before joining the Department of Justice, Leaman spent nearly a decade representing police officers and police unions in collective bargaining, contract administration, internal affairs investigations, and investigations involving on-duty uses of force. His practice also included civil rights and employment litigation. He earned his Juris Doctor from Oklahoma City University and holds bachelor's degrees in Psychology and History from the University of Oklahoma.

AUSTIN MURREY

Managing Attorney, Canadian County District Attorney's Office

Austin Murrey is the Managing Attorney for the Canadian County District Attorney's Office, a position he has held for 15 years. Murrey handles all levels of criminal prosecution including homicides, drug trafficking, internet crimes against children and appellate work.

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BLAINE PHILLIPS

Special Agent, Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation

Blaine Phillips has served in law enforcement for 26 years and currently serves the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as a Special Agent assigned to the Internet Crimes Against Children Taskforce. Blaine previously worked for the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics where he was assigned to the agency's Human Trafficking Unit where he specialized in HT investigations. Blaine enjoys teaching and is an instructor for the OSBI teaching continuing education classes on Human Trafficking, Online Investigations, ICAC Investigations, and Advanced Police Report Writing.

Blaine holds an Advanced Council of Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) certification, he was named OBN's 2017 Agent of the Year, and is a member of the Oklahoma Attorney General's Anti-Human Trafficking Working Group. Blaine holds a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Arizona, majoring in Social and Criminal Justice and with a minor in Public Administration and a Master's of Science at Colorado State University, majoring in Organizational Leadership.

MADISON REBEL

Special Agent, ATF

Rebel is a Special Agent with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), assigned to the Muskogee, Oklahoma Field Office. Since joining the agency in 2021, Special Agent Rebel has participated in numerous investigations involving violent crime and firearms-related offenses. SA Rebel currently serves on the ATF National Response Team (NRT), a specialized unit responsible for investigating major fires, explosions, bombings, and arson incidents nationwide. In addition, SA Rebel serves as the ATF Eastern District of Oklahoma Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Coordinator, where she works to strengthen partnerships among law enforcement agencies, courts, victim service providers, and community organizations to support a coordinated response to violence against women.

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RYAN STEPHENSON

Assistant Executive Coordinator, Oklahoma District Attorney's Council

Ryan Stephenson is the Assistant Executive Coordinator for the District Attorneys Council. He joined the Oklahoma County DA's Office in 2010 and worked as an Assistant District Attorney there until 2022. During his tenure, he held several leadership roles before ultimately being promoted to Chief of the Criminal Division. Stephenson transferred to Pottawatomie County in 2023 and served there until joining the District Attorneys Council in February of 2024, where he currently serves as a special prosecutor and the legislative liaison for Oklahoma's District Attorneys. He has prosecuted a wide variety of cases including violent crimes, crimes against children, sex crimes, and capital homicides. Stephenson has a Bachelor of Science in Biology from Oklahoma Christian University and graduated from the University of Oklahoma College of Law in 2011.

MARK SWAFFORD

Network Intrusion Forensic Analyst, U.S. Secret Service

Mark T. Swafford serves as a Network Intrusion Forensic Analyst (NIFA) with the United States Secret Service at the National Computer Forensics Institute (NCFI) Lab. His career in Oklahoma law enforcement includes two decades as a police officer and detective with the Sapulpa Police Department and service as an investigator for the Tulsa County District Attorney's Office. Since 2009, he has specialized in digital evidence extraction and mobile device forensics, supporting local, state, and federal criminal investigations.

Agent Swafford holds Advanced CLEET certification and extensive specialized training through the National Computer Forensics Institute and Cellebrite, covering mobile device examination, network intrusion, and cybercrime investigation. A recipient of the OSBI Director's Award for his contributions to regional digital evidence examinations, he actively instructs and proctors courses nationally on ransomware, business email compromise, drone forensics, and device triage. He also developed and teaches the CLEET-accredited curriculum Electronic Devices and Data as Evidence for law enforcement officers and prosecutors.

ROB WALLACE

Assistant U.S. Attorney, Eastern District of Oklahoma

Rob Wallace has more than 30 years of legal experience, including more than two decades in public service. He currently serves as Criminal Chief for the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Oklahoma, where he has held a variety of leadership roles since joining the Department of Justice in 2004. His areas of expertise include violent crime in Indian Country, gang prosecution, and drug conspiracies. Following the United States Supreme Court's decision in *McGirt v. Oklahoma*, Wallace was part of the Eastern District's management team that worked with FBI leadership to develop and implement a case-intake system that processed more than 6,000 cases affected by changes in criminal jurisdiction.

Before returning to the U.S. Attorney's Office, Wallace served as an elected District Attorney for Oklahoma's 16th District, covering LeFlore and Latimer Counties, where he personally prosecuted homicide, including death-penalty cases, drug manufacturing, and other major felony cases. He has also served as Chair of the Criminal Justice Department at Northeastern State University and as Chair of the Oklahoma District Attorneys Council, where he helped oversee state and federal funds and coordinate legislative activities for district attorneys across Oklahoma. Wallace has lectured nationally and internationally on law enforcement and prosecution topics and earned his bachelor's degree in Political Science from the University of Oklahoma and his Juris Doctor from the University of Oklahoma College of Law.



COREY WELLS

Special Agent Canine Handler, ATF

Corey Wells is a Special Agent with the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He has been employed with this agency since 2018. As an ATF Special Agent, he has participated in numerous investigations involving violent crimes. He is now assigned to the ATF K9 Division. He and his K9 partner (K9 Tara) are used to further assist investigations by locating evidence such as firearms, ammunition, shell casings, and explosives.

Prior to joining the ATF, he was a Narcotics Agent for the Oklahoma Bureau Narcotics (OBN) for more than six years. During his time with OBN, he worked as an undercover narcotics agent and as a K9 handler on the drug interdiction team. He was also Police Officer with the Bossier City Police Department, in Bossier City, LA for more than four years.

COL. KEDRICK WILLS (RET.)

Idaho State Police

Colonel Kedrick Wills (Ret.) spent nearly 30 years in law enforcement, beginning his career in 1995 as a bilingual patrol officer before joining the Idaho State Police (ISP) in 1996. Throughout his tenure, he served in numerous leadership roles, culminating in his 2017 appointment to the Idaho Governor's Cabinet as Director of the Idaho State Police.
